Culture and Leisure

Léry is fortunate to have a diverse range of recreational opportunities available for citizens of all ages. Here are the achievements for citizens and families that I have endorsed:

- The enhancement of the free offer in leisure, culture, and sports for families and easier access through, among other things, the reimbursement of registration fees for seniors and young people under 17 years old;
- Under the leadership of Ms. Liette Lamarre, municipal councillor, the implementation of the Age-Friendly Municipality (MADA) program aims to break isolation and promote physical fitness through subsidized activities and services:
 - The walking club, conferences, pickleball, Viactive, singing together in the parks, community meals, the installation of exercise benches at Raymond-Faubert Park and benches along the chemin du Lac-Saint-Louis.
- Family activities have been maintained and enhanced, such as the Easter egg hunt, Family Day, the fishing activity for children, soccer for kids, Festi Léry, the bike rally, pumpkin decorating for Halloween, and the children's Christmas.
 - We have added the Friendship Evening for young kids aged 7 to 14 and the 8 Soirées-O-Quai, cultural events for the whole family, every Friday night in July and August 2025.
- In a spirit of transparency and to give a voice to citizens, we have created multiple citizen committees: MADA, Toponymy, Coeur villageois (Village heart), Culture & Leisure, Civil Security, Human Resources, Public Works, Internet site.

Access to Lake Saint-Louis

I have taken on the challenge of finding ways to allow all citizens of Léry to access Lake Saint-Louis. Despite the former mayor's refusal to collaborate and the Woodland Nautical Club he leads, two key initiatives have been implemented to provide access to Lake Saint-Louis:

• The installation of a summer dock at Presqu'Île Asselin

• The rental of kayaks and paddle boards for free for the citizens of Léry every weekend in the summer

Other initiatives for the well-being of our community:

- The rental of sports activities at l'Archipel school gymnasium to practice badminton or pickleball;
- The redesign of the urban boulevard at the corner of Arlette-Vincter Street and Léry Boulevard (Route 132) to ensure the safety of children and citizens

 Plans and specifications are nearly completed, with work expected to begin in 2026;
- The installation of speed bumps and speed display signs on the chemin du Lac-Saint-Louis to reduce speed and increase the safety of children and citizens;
- **Financial support** to several organizations, such as the Optimist Club, the Anna Laberge Foundation, the Gisèle-Faubert Foundation, and Operation Nez Rouge.
